Traffic Order on the occasion of the World Economic Forum 2020 Davos within the Municipality

1. <u>Current conditions</u>

Pursuant to Art. 3, para. 6 of the Swiss Road Act (SVG; SR 741.01), measures limited in time are required both in advance of and after the WEF 2020. The measures include various measures for standing and moving traffic as well as general traffic flow, decreed by the executive municipal council as follows:

2. <u>Temporary Traffic Order</u>

The following traffic orders apply to increase safety for the entire road network within Davos:

2.1. Measures: Promenade

- 2.1.1. As of Monday, January 6, 2020 drivers must be prepared for delays and short closures along the entire Promenade. We recommend following the detour signs.
- 2.1.2. Closure of partial route at the Scaletta street intersection to the English Church:

Starting on Sunday, January 19, 2020 / 3:00 pm through Saturday, January 25, 2020 / 6:00 pm, the Promenade will be closed from the turn off Promenade / Scallettastasse to the English Church and traffic will be diverted via the Scalettastrasse. Traffic with permits are excluded from these measures (VBD until Sunday, January 19, 2020 at 10 pm and as of Saturday, January 25, 2020 at 5:30 am). Travel with permits is permitted between the Scalettastrasse intersection and the Hertistrasse.

2.1.3. Closure of the section of road at the Montana crossing to Hotel Parsenn:

As of Sunday, January 19, 2020 / 10 am, through Saturday, January 25, 2020 / 6 pm, the area of Hotel Seehof, between the Intersection at the Montana and the Hotel Parsenn is closed. Travel with pemits is

excluded from this measure. Traffic will be routed to the Talstrasse, which is in two-way traffic.

2.1.4. On-coming traffic on the Promenade; Hotel Parsenn/Café Weber up to Scaletta street:

Starting on Sunday, January 19, 2020 / 3:00 pm through Saturday, January 25, 2020 / 6:00 pm, the Promenade will be opened to on-going traffic at the section of road from the corner Hotel Parsenn / Café Weber up to the intersection at Scaletta street.

2.1.5. Scaletta parking log:

As of Sunday, January 19, 2020 / 5:00 pm, to Saturday, January 25, 2020 / 6:00 pm, part of the parking lot at Scaletta next to the access to Hotel Ameron is closed and reserved for the use of the police and WEF.

2.1.6. Parking Symond:

Starting Sunday, January 19, 2020 / 5:00 pm through Saturday, January 25, 2020 / 6:00 pm, a section of the parking lot at Symond is closed to the public and made available as required to the police and WEF.

2.1.7. Parking lot at Horlauben:

Starting Monday, January 6, 2020 / 7:00 am through Monday, January 27, 2020 / 6:00 pm, the parking lot at Horlauben is closed to the public and made available as required to the police and WEF.

2.1.8. Parking lot at the Library:

Starting Friday, January 17, 2020 / 6:00 pm through Monday, January 27, 2020 / 6:00 pm, the parking lot at the Library (Schweizerhaus) is closed to the public and made available as required to the police and WEF.

2.1.9. Park at the Kirchner Museum:

Starting Monday, January 6, 2020 / 7:00 am through Saturday, February 1, 2020 / 6:00 pm, the Park at the Kirchner Museum is closed to the public and made available as a waiting area for authorized vehicles. A municipal permit required to park vehicles.

2.1.10. Closure of the sidewalk along the Promenade:

Starting Sunday, January 19, 2020 / 5:00 pm through Saturday, January 25, 2020 / 6:00 pm, the Promenade is blocked to pedestrian traffic between the Kongress Hotel and the intersection at Scaletta Street at the English Church. Personnel accredited by WEF are excluded by these measures.

2.2. Measures: Talstrasse

2.2.1. Two-way traffic along the Talstrasse:

Starting Monday, January 6, 2020 / 2:00 pm through Friday, January 31, 2020 / 12:00 pm, the Talstrasse will be open to two-way traffic between the Davos Platz train station and the Montana intersection.

2.2.2. Closure of Congress Center parking lot:

Starting Sunday, January 12, 2020 / 7:00 am through Monday, January 27, 2020 / 6:00 pm, the Congress Center parking lot is closed for security reasons and made available as required for the police and WEF.

2.2.3. Closure of Metz parking lot:

As of Thursday, January 2, 2020 / 7:00 am through Monday January 27, 2020 / 6:00 pm, the entire Metz parking lot is closed for the use of the police and WEF. Part of the parking lot is opened for the five HCD home matches on Sunday, January 5, Tuesday, January 7, Saturday, January 11, Friday, January 17 as well as Sunday, January 26, 2020.

2.2.4. No turn at intersection Tal street/Herti street:

No left turns permitted as of Sunday, January 19, 2020 / 2:00 pm through Saturday, January 25, 2020 / 6:00 pm on the Talstrasse in the direction of Herti street (Congress side). Only right turns permitted from Herti street (Kongress side) into the Tal street.

2.2.5. Provisional traffic recommendation:

You should anticipate traffic jams along the Talstrasse between the cut off Albana and the Hertistrasse in the direction of Davos Dorf. For this reason, we recommend using the marked detour via the Matta and Dischmastrasse when driving from Davos Platz to Davos Dorf.

2.3. Measures: Hertistrasse

As of Sunday January 19, 2020 / 6:00 pm, through Saturday January 25, 2020 / 6:00 pm, the Hertistrasse is closed to pedestrians and vehicles between the Promenade and the Talstrasse. Personnel accredited by WEF and residents are excluded by these measures.

2.4. Measure: Richtstattweg

Starting Sunday, January 19, 2020 / 5:00 pm through Saturday, January 25, 2020 / 6:00 pm, the Richtstattweg will be closed between the Promenade and Scalettastrasse. Residences and police vehicles are exempted from this measure.

2.5. Measures for Panorama parking lot at the ice stadium

As of Thursday, January 2, 2020 / 7:00 am through Thursday January 30, 2020 / 12:00 pm, the entire Panorama parking lot is closed for the use of the police and WEF. Part of the parking lot is opened for the five HCD home matches on Sunday, January 5, Tuesday, January 7, Saturday, January 11, Friday, January 17 as well as Sunday, January 26, 2020.

2.6. Measures for pedestrian paths in the Kurpark

As of Sunday, January 19, 2020 / 7:00 am, through Monday, January 27, 2020 / 6:00 pm, the paths through the Kurpark (Carl-Dorno path and Jules-Ferdmann path) are closed between the Congress center and the Ice stadium as well as access to the swimming pool.

2.7. Measure Reginaweg / Alteinstrasse

As of Sunday, January 19, 2020 / 2:00 pm, through Saturday, January 25, Januar 2020 / 6:00 pm, access to the Reginaweg and to Alteinstrasse is only possible via the Talstrasse. Access from and to the Promenade is blocked.

2.8. Measure: Symondstrasse

Starting Sunday, January 19, 2020 / 2:00 pm through Saturday, January 25, 2020 / 6:00 pm, the Symondstrasse will be closed between the Promenade and Richtstattweg.

2.9. Measures: Obere Strasse

Starting Sunday, January 19 2020 / 5:00 pm through Saturday, January 25, 2020 / 6:00 pm, the Obere Strasse will be closed in the area around the Hotel Steigenberger Belvédère. Travel with pemits is excluded from this measure.

2.10. Measures: Dorfstrasse

As of Sunday January 19, 2020 / 5:00 pm, through Saturday January 25, 2020 / 6:00 pm, the Dorfstrasse is closed between the Spar parking lot and Hotel Seehof. The Salzgäba street behind the Seehof is closed to pedestrian traffic.

2.11. Measured: Mühlestrasse

Starting Sunday, January 19, 2020 / 8:00 am through Friday, January 24, 2020 / 6:00 pm, the entrance to the Mühlestrasse is closed as viewed from the Bahnhofstrasse and continued with one-way traffic in the direction of the Bahnhofstrasse. Truck traffic can continue in both directions. The Bünda quarter is accessed via the Museumstrasse.

2.12. Measures: Flüelastrasse

As of Monday, January 6, 2020 / 8:00 am, through Saturday, February 1, 2020 / 6:00 pm, expect delays on the Flüelastrasse between the intersection at Bahnhofstrasse Sagenstutz (above Fährich) as well as temporary closures. A section of this route is used as a waiting area and traffic may be detoured with traffic signs.

2.13. Measures: Lake parking lot / Lake promenade

As of Thursday, January 2, 2020 / 7:00 am through Wednesday, January 29, 2020 / 6:00 pm, the entire Seepark plaza is closed for the use of the police and WEF. A temporary public parking lot will be set up

along the Flüelastrasse Höhe at Stilli as a replacement. The lake promenade can be reached from there on foot over the Stillistrasse.

The lake promenade is closed between the lake parking lot and the Strandbad as of Thursday, January 16, 2020 / 7:00 am through Wednesday, January 29, 2020 / 6:00 pm for all traffic as well as for pedestrians. Signs mark the detour of the path around the lake.

2.14. Special order for public transportation

Between January 20 and January 24, 2020, buses will be operating under a special WEF schedule (changed VBD lines and times). Individual bus stops will be moved or closed in the period of January 13 - 27, 2020. More detailed information to be published in January in the Davoser Zeitung, on vbd.ch, in the SBB online schedule, and directly in buses and bus stops.

Public transportation may be closed in part or completely for any traffic disturbances, demonstrations, etc..

3. Limited parking and places to stop

- **3.1.** Parking and places to stop may be limited in the following zones:
 - Along the Promenade
 - Along the Talstrasse
 - Along the Scalettastrasse
 - In the rectangle Bahnhofstrasse Dorf Alte Flüelastrasse Dorfstrasse – Bahnhofstrasse Dorf

The limited parking and places to stop will be marked with no parking signs or no stopping signs accordingly.

- **3.2.** It is prohibited to halt or park autos, trailers, etc. on public property within the marked sections. Deployed vehicles from the security institutions as well as vehicles entitled and marked with associated stickers exempted.
- **3.3.** Parking and stoping during the set up and taking down of the facilities along the indicated sections of road requires a permit by the

municipality for the assigned locations. Submit any applications to the Davos Office of Public Safety (081 414 30 30) as early as possible.

- **3.4.** Vehicles and trailers parked on private property, must be identifiable at all times from the entitled property owner and assigned to an individual.
- 3.5. Vehicles not permitted or that hinder traffic as well as any vehicles that cannot be identified, are removed at the expense of the impacted party. The legal owner can retrieve towed vehicles against payment for costs (transportation and parking) at the Cantonal Police Davos.

4. General Instructions

In advance of and during the WEF 2020, expect traffic delays, changed routes as well as short-term closures throughout the entire Davos road network, expecially in the event of any disruptions in traffic resulting, for example, from a demonstration. An easy-to-read map on the traffic concept during the WEF 2020 is available at www.gemeindedavos.ch.

5. <u>Validity</u>

Traffic orders and restrictions, limited in time, are valid pursuant to Art. 107, para. 2 Signal ordinance (SSV) for the period of Wednesday, January 1, 2020 / 7:00 am through Saturday, February 1, 2020 / 6 pm, unless superceded by other periods of validity in the provision above or appropriate signs are added or removed.
